HIGHLIGHTS AND DEVELOPMENTS

Education Gets Priority in National Budget

Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, King Abdullah ibn Abdul'Aziz unveiled the national budget for 2008. It has allocated a record SR 105 billion (US\$ 28 billion), more than a quarter of the new budget, for education and training. Saudi Arabia in recent years has been spending hugely on education and manpower training, which highlights the leadership's desire for building capacities and securing a better future for the new generation.

"The budget will also boost scientific research and technological development," the King said referring to financial allocations made for new research centers at universities.

KFUPM has received SR 821.99 million (~US\$219 million) in the 2008 budget.

New Centers for Higher Learning

Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, King Abdullah approved on December 2, 2007 the establishment of 29 new faculties and several other institutes and research centers – including for

nanotechnology - which give a major boost to higher education in the country. The Royal approval was based on the decisions adopted by the Higher Education Council, H.E. Dr. Khalid Al-Ankari, Minister of Higher Education, announced.

The new faculties and institutes are spread out all over the country and cover specialties that include nanotechnology, medicine, engineering, pharmacy, IT, computer engineering, and dentistry, among other subjects. H.E. Dr. Al-Ankari said Royal directives to give more attention to developing nanotechnologies have led to the establishment of two new research centers, one at King Saud University and the other at KFUPM. KFUPM will also host the Center for Strategic Planning Studies.

New Vice-Rectorship Established

Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, King Abdullah ibn Abdul'Aziz has approved the decision of the Supreme Council of Higher Education regarding establishing the Vice-Rectorship for Technology Development and Industrial Relations and appointing Dr. Faleh Al-Sulaiman as the Vice-Rector. This new position has been created to give a high profile to technology development and transfer from translational research, and establish a more productive relationship with businesses and industry in Saudi Arabia. This position is unique, and is one of the firsts, like many others, that KFUPM has taken lead of in the Kingdom.

KFUPM Shortlisted for KAUST Center

Out of forty-one proposals submitted by world's leading scientific and engineering research universities for new research centers in response to the Global Research Partnership of King Abdullah University of Science and Technology (KAUST), KFUPM has been short-listed to final round of proposals selection. The proposed center is titled: Transformative Research in Petrochemicals & Polymers. The global competition is the first major step in establishing KAUST Centers - university-based, multi-investigator research programs focused on KAUST mission areas - around the globe.

The KAUST Global Research Partnership (GRP) is a 10-year, peer-reviewed, merit-based program to fund research in the areas of science and technology that are important to Saudi Arabia, the region, and the world, while simultaneously linking KAUST to the existing global research enterprise. KAUST Center grants are for five years of support at up to US\$5 million per year.

Sabic Chief "Most Influential in Chemicals Sector"

Mr. Mohamed Al-Mady, Vice-Chairman and CEO of Sabic and Chairman of the Gulf Petrochemicals and Chemicals Association (GPCA) and a member of the IAB, has been named the world's most influential person in the global chemicals industry. Al-Mady has made it to the list of Top 40 Power Players in the fields of chemicals worldwide that is published annually by the London-based international industry magazine, ICIS Chemical Business.

We are proud of our close association with Mr. Al-Mady, and extend our warmest congratulations and best wishes to him for continued success.
